ANTI RAGGING COMMITTEE PROGRAM

OBJECTIVE:

To promote awareness and prevention of ragging, many colleges organize various competitions aimed at engaging students in creating a safer and more inclusive environment. These competitions serve as a platform to raise awareness, encourage proactive behaviour, and foster a positive college culture. This report provides an overview of anti-ragging related competitions conducted in our college, detailing their objectives, participation, outcomes, and recommendations for future events. PROGRAM:

DAY 1: 13.08.2024

Short film:To visually convey the impacts of ragging and the importance of a respectful and supportive campus environment. Approximately 95 Pre service teachers of B.Ed., II year and all the faculty members attended the screening. The film effectively communicated the anti-ragging message, prompting discussions and reflections among viewers. It served as a powerful tool to raise awareness and generate empathy.

Poster Making: To create impactful visual messages that promote anti-ragging awareness. The competition highlighted students' creativity and contributed to a visually engaging anti-ragging environment. Nearly 5 members took part in the competition.

DAY 2: 14.08.2024

Essay Writing: In the fore noon session around 20 pre-service teachers participated in the essay competition. To encourage students to reflect on and articulate the importance of preventing ragging and fostering a respectful campus environment.

Selfie Corner: In the afternoon session, all the Pre-service teachers were asked to engage themselves in an interactive way while promoting anti-ragging messages. Over 95 pre-service teachers took selfies

and shared them on social media with anti-ragging hashtags. The selfie corner created a positive and interactive way for students to engage with the anti-ragging message, increasing visibility and support on social media.

DAY 3: 16.08.2024


